

# From the kitchen of Diana

#### **DELUXE THREE-EGG WHITE CAKE**

This recipe brings back memories of my young- 1/2 tsp. salt er days when my Mom made this Five Roses 1/2 cup Crisco Shortening cake for my birthday every year. I love raspberries and she would put raspberry jam between 3 eggs, separated the layers and ice it with a vanilla flavoured 1 tsp. vanilla white icing. The beauty of this cake is that you 1 cup milk can make so many variations. I have made it Stir Flour, baking powder and salt together. with a fruit filling between the layers. Also good Cream shortening ; gradually add sugar, beating is a lemon curd, vanilla custard filling or milk or between additions. Add egg yolks and beat until dark chocolate ganache and of course, for the fluffy. Add dry ingredients, alternately with cake flavouring, you could swap out the vanilla milk, blending well after each addition. Stir in for lemon, orange or almond flavouring. Icings vanilla. Beat egg whites until stiff but not dry; can be whipped cream and white chocolate, but- fold into batter. Pour into two greased and ter cream or cream cheese or maybe 7-Minute floured or lined 8 inch layer cake pans. Bake in Frosting. I loved it when my grandmother iced a a moderate oven(350 degrees F) 25to30 minutes cake with 7-Minute Frosting.

Anyway, hope this inspires some ideas for this very versatile cake.

2 cups Five Roses All-Purpose Flour 3 tsp. baking powder 1-1/4 cups sugar

Moose are excellent swimmers and can swim up to 10 miles (16km) without stopping. They can even dive up to 20 feet underwater. A bull moose can regrow their massive antlers every year. The antlers can grow up to an inch per day during peak summer growth, making them one of the fastest-growing bones in the animal kingdom. Moose are also silent walkers despite their massive size, they can move quietly through thick forests due to their specially designed hooves, which spread apart to distribute weight, and they can run up to 35 miles per hour (56km/h) on land. They were very popular with locals and visitors during their duration.

Sincere condolences to all and let's hope that 2025 is not a repeat of 2024 for families from Latchford and those with strong Latchford connections. Once we have received obituaries for Jeff and Gord they will be included in a future issue. 


#### **LEGAULT.** Claude 1941 - 2025

#### Latchford Volunteer Fire Department Ice Safety

There is no such thing as completely safe when dealing with ice. Be suspicious. You cannot tell the strength of the ice by its appearance. Temperature, thickness, snow cover, water depth, N size of water body, currents and distribution of the load on top of the ice are all factors affecting ice safety. Always check ice thickness before venturing out. Snowmobiles require at least five inches of clear solid ice and autos at least eight inches to a foot of clear solid ice.

Check reported conditions. Before you head onto any ice, check with a local bait shop operator or resort owner for known ice conditions, thin ice areas or dangerous open water conditions.

Avoid travelling on ice at night. Clear hard ice is the only kind of ice recommended for travel; keep away from unfamiliar paths or unknown ice.

Suit up. If you must venture onto the ice, wear a thermal protection buoyant suit to increase your chances of survival if you fall through. If you do not have one, wear a lifejacket/PFD over an ordinary snowmobile suit or layered winter clothing

#### Avoid:

- Slushy ice
- Thawed ice that has recently refrozen

- Layered or rotten ice caused by sudden temperature changes
- Ice near moving water (i.e. rivers or currents)

Never go on the ice alone. A buddy may be able to rescue you or go for help if you get into difficulty.

Inform someone. Before you leave shore, inform someone of your destination and expected time of return.

Assemble a kit. Assemble a small personal safety kit no larger than the size of a man's wallet to carry with you. The kit should include a lighter, waterproof matches, magnesium fire starter, pocketknife, compass and whistle. You should also carry ice picks, an ice staff, a rope and a cellular phone.

#### Know what to do if you hear the ice crack:

- Lay down on the ice.
- Call for help loudly and clearly.
- Crawl or roll back to land.

#### Self-rescue steps:

- Float on your stomach facing the shore.
- Reach forward onto the ice; do not push down on it.
- Kick your legs to slowly push your torso onto the ice.
- Crawl or roll away from the hole.
- If you can't climb onto the ice, float in the water and call for help loudly and clearly.
- Get medical help immediately.
